*(Those of you with cameras are invited to assemble on
the Trail 6 Beach near the Breakwater to photograph the
balloon raising for our next WBPS Newsletter)*

This letter was sent June 28th to the UBC Manager of the
Campus Planning Infrastructure by Judy Williams,
Chair, WBPS

Thank you for the advance notice and invitation of
June 28th to witness the balloon study being
conducted by Photoblimp and being
photographed from strategic locations on the
beach at 10 a.m. by UBC consultants tentatively on
July 10 with a low tide of 3.0 m. on that morning.
When you were surveying for the Ponderosa
complex and before that, for the Marine Student
Residence Towers, the photographers and
surveyors were forced part of the time to work
from a bobbing boat. Might we suggest more
accurate readings could be done from a sandy
rather than a watery surface? When a similar
study was done for the Ponderosa Complex, a mix-
up occurred and we never received an invitation to
the blimp raising then. We therefore truly
appreciate the opportunity to be a part of history
in the making now! Here are the 10 a.m. low tides
for the following dates which might make your on-
the-beach photography just a tad bit easier and
more accurate. As you can see, the highest tide is
on the date you have selected. If you want to give
a more accurate idea of how visible your Orchard
Commons buildings will be at low tide, particularly
in the winter months when the Marine Towers are
much more visible from the beach at low tide, you
might want to select a day with the lowest tide
which would be Wednesday, July 18th:

July 10--3.0 m./July 11- 2.5 m./July 13-- 1.3 m./
July 16-- 1.1 m./July 17-- 1.3 m./July 18-- 1.0 m.
July 19-- 2.4 m.

We have a number of questions: (1) Will those on-
the-beach marker locations be the same ones as
for the Ponderosa Complex? Yes, as per the
attached plan. (2) Where can we find the detailed
plans for the proposed Point Grey Campus
Student Housing to be named Orchard
Commons--Do you have a direct link? We are in
the early planning stages for this proposed
development so there are no detailed plans
available for review. Our current feasibility work is
meant to determine the size of development (i.e.
number of student residence beds) that can
reasonably be accommodated on the site.
Determining the potential height of the residence
towers is part of that process. (3) If the
"development schedule is under review," does
that mean the Board of Governors have given a
First Reading or conceptual approval on student
housing and amenities in that location? The
Orchard Commons project is still in early planning
as noted above and has therefore not yet gone to
the Board of Governors for specific review and
approval as a standalone capital project. The
Vancouver Campus Plan, which was adopted by
the Board of Governors in June 2010, does identify
a "mixed use hub" development incorporating
student housing to be located at the northeast
corner of West Mall and Agronomy Road. Here is

have completed planning for the project, including
preparation of a functional program, the project
will commence the standard Board of Governors
capital project approval process. The earliest that
this would commence is Spring 2013. (4) Have you
gone before the AUDP folks yet for initial input and
guidance on the proposal? Not yet. (5) If you have
not yet taken this proposal before the AUDP, at
what stage or at what point in time do you plan on
doing so? This will not happen until after we
receive initial Board 1 approval to commence
design. It will probably take about 3-4 months
after Board 1 approval before we are far enough
along with schematic design to present to the
AUDP. Might the WBPS be invited ahead of time
to observe quietly during that meeting? I think
that this would be possible given that AUDP
meetings are meant to be open to members of the
University community. I will defer to Joe Stott for
final confirmation given that C&CP run the AUDP
process. Note that the AUDP review is part of the
standard Development Permit review process that
applies to all major capital projects at UBC. This
process includes a Public Open House, so there
will be an opportunity for the public to review the
design for Orchard Commons before a
Development Permit is issued. (6) You mention
that you will have UBC "feasibility study
architects" at the balloon-raising site. Does this
mean that they have already drafted a feasibility
study for that site, and if so, is it open to public
perusal? No. As noted above they are in the
process of determining potential site capacity.
(7) When the WBPS hired a blimp to do our study
regarding visibility of the Marine Student Towers
from the Beach and their potential intrusion into
our view corridors from the beach, the balloonist
photographed the views from the proposed
building at differing and varied various floor
heights. Will you be doing the same visual
recording and will it be made public? The
intention is to assess only the views from the
beach up toward the proposed development with
the intent to minimize the visual impact of the
development for beach users. This is the same
scope as for the Ponderosa Commons balloon
study. 8. What is the proposed elevation of the
highest building in the Orchard Commons,
including the "academic space and community
amenities"? This will be determined based in part
on the results of the balloon study. 9. What sort
of community amenities are you proposing for that
site? This has not been finalized yet, but typical
amenities for our Commons developments
include: food outlet, fitness facility, daycare
facility, end-of-trip facility for cyclists, collegium
for commuter students and informal study
spaces. For example, would it include a pool since
we would be concerned about drainage? A pool is
not contemplated for this development. And (10)
Will all the Orchard Commons buildings be built at
grade or will deep excavation be necessary? An
excavation will be necessary in order to provide
the foundation and footings necessary to support
the residence towers. The required depth of the
excavation will be determined as part of the design
process.

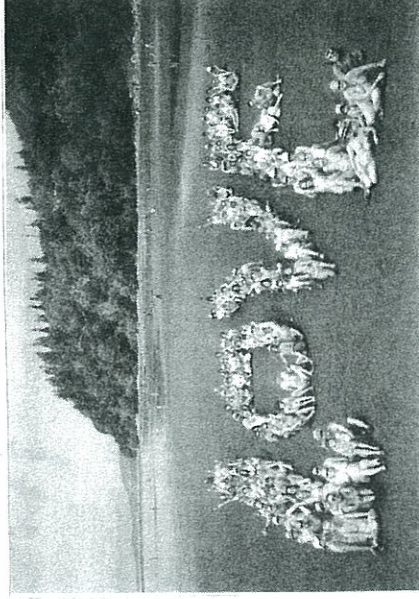
"BROWNISH" WRECK BEACH WASHROOMS A MOVING EXPERIENCE

Supervisor for West Area Parks, we are
still looking at the end of July for the
completion of both the upper and lower
washrooms designed by Bruce
Carscadden Architects and being
constructed by Archway Construction.
Because of the delays in construction,
(the buildings were supposed to have
been completed by the start of the
summer season), the site plantings will
have to be delayed until Fall. Currently,
the concrete holding tanks have been
placed and the actual galvanized steel,
pre-fabricated outhouses themselves
will be in place by end of July. At the time
of this printing, plans are to paint them a
brownish colour.
